What is meant by public involvement in research?

• **Involvement** – where members of the public are actively involved in research projects and in research organisations.










Public involvement is not

Participation – where people take part in a research study.



• Engagement – where information and knowledge about research is

provided and disseminated.





Why is public involvement in research important?

Ensures the public are equal partners.

Ensures the public have a voice.

Leads to research that is relevant to people's needs and concerns.

Funders of research and ethics committees expect it.





What does public involvement in research look like?

It spans planning, delivering and disseminating research findings. It could be with researchers, policy makers, charities, funders and health and social care professionals.





How can we ensure public involvement in research happens?

The Involving People Network is supported by the Health and Care Research Wales Public Involvement & Engagement Team.

Members of the public can **join the Involving People Network** and use their experience as a patient, carer or service user to make a difference.






Supporting Researchers
